AHDR – WHO WE ARE

The Association for Historical Dialogue and Research is an inter-communal, non-profit, and non-governmental organization established in 2003 in Nicosia, Cyprus. The AHDR envisions to contribute to the advancement of dialogue, critical thinking and intercultural understanding amongst teachers, students, and the general public by providing access to various learning opportunities for all. More specifically, the AHDR promotes the study and research of the History of Cyprus in a critical and comprehensive way; develops supplementary educational material for educators and students in relation to History and Peace/ Anti-racist Education to be shared and used in and beyond classrooms; increases public awareness on the importance of dialogue and multiperspectivity; promotes a Culture of Peace and Non-Violence through education at a local, national, and international level. In 2011 the AHDR opened the Home for Cooperation (H4C), a unique educational, cultural and community centre in the heart of Nicosia, in the UN Buffer Zone.

WHAT WE DO?

- Collect, archive and share resources and materials on history education and peace education.
- Create opportunities for educators, youth, and children in the fields of history education and peace education.
- Ensure individuals' access and provide them with equal learning opportunities irrespective of their ability, ethnic and cultural background.
- Contribute to existing literature and resources by designing supplementary educational material based on the needs of youth and educators in Cyprus.
- Nurture critical understanding and increase public awareness on the importance of dialogue and multiperspectivity on issues of history.
- Enhance understanding, respect, and cooperation among all communities in Cyprus and promote a culture of peace through education, at local, national, and international levels.
- Promote the study and research the history of Cyprus critically to follow global trends and good practices in education and innovatively adapt them to the local context.

EUROPEAN SOLIDARITY CORPS - VOLUNTEERING PROJECT

European Solidarity Corps volunteering project will be carried out by the Association for Historical Dialogue and Research (AHDR) for 5 months in Nicosia. The participant will be working from our offices at the Home for Cooperation, a unique community centre that hosts and organizes numerous educational, cultural, and artistic events throughout the year.

The AHDR aims to host a Greek-speaking volunteer who is driven by a passion for history, education, and social change. The project aims to contribute to the educational, research and cultural activities of the Association. Through the participant's involvement in the proposed activities, the AHDR invites young people to become part of the efforts to build bridges between the island's communities and help in the deconstruction of stereotypes. It is envisioned that these activities will allow for the development of critical thinking, to the cultivation of openness regarding listening to one another, and therefore accept everyone as equal, while at the same time respect and appreciate their differences.

ACTIVITIES IMPLEMENTED IN THE PROJECT

- Organization of educational activities and/or cultural events.
- Development of content and outreach material.
- Assistance in project implementation in the fields of history and peace education.
- Research, analysis of data, and report writing.
- Planning, design, and implementation of events and trainings.
- Networking and collaboration with local and international organizations.
- Any other activities envisioned by the AHDR current project work.

PARTICIPANT PROFILE

- 18-30 years old.
- Excellent written and spoken English, and Greek.
- Must be legally able to cross from crossing points.
- Passion and/or interest for history education, peace education, human rights, peace and conflict studies, intercultural communication, anthropology, sociology, psychology, media, and cultural studies.
- Motivated and creative.
- Strong computer skills, especially a very good command of MS Office.
- Has enthusiasm and commitment.
- Flexibility and capability to work independently.
- Strong interpersonal skills with an ability to work as part of a team.
- Participant who is curious and open-minded learning and grow with us.

LANGUAGE TRAINING

The participant will be offered free of charge language support either online or on-site at the Home for Cooperation. The participant will be expected to dedicate around two hours a week to attend the language courses.

TRAINING AND SUPPORT

AHDR Financial and Operations Officer will be responsible for the orientation and monitoring of the participant's activities and tasks and for supporting them with the promotion of the organization's activities, and with the organization and implementation of their own tasks. Participant will be provided an external mentor to support them with any need during the project period. The staff of the AHDR will be working closely with the participant, to provide on-the-job training and continuous support, ensuring the participant is making the most of his/her time and enhancing their professional competences. As part of their everyday work, the participant will be invited to attend meetings, presentations, trainings, and other events of the organization.

PRACTICAL INFORMATION & BENEFITS

WORKING HOURS

The participant has the flexibility of working from 9 am to 4 pm or from 10 am to 5 pm during weekdays. At the same time, they will also be invited to participate in afternoon or weekend activities. In such cases, overtime hours, will be compensated according to the organization's procedures.

DAYS-OFF AND HOLIDAYS

Every week the participant will have weekend days off and holidays that are set by the organization. Also, each participant has the right to use 2 days-off per month.

POCKET MONEY & FOOD ALLOWANCE

Pocket money (5€ per day) and food allowance (7€ per day) will be provided at the beginning of every month, per participant, to cover food and other expenses, both during and outside of working hours.

ACCOMMODATION

The participant will have the chance to live in a furnished rented flat, shared with another participant in the Republic of Cyprus if they choose to. The participant will have their own bedroom, a shared kitchen and bathroom. In addition, they will have the option of using a bike from the H4C, free of charge, for commuting. If the participant has their own space/flat, they will be provided petrol allowance at the end of every month.

INSURANCE

In the case that European Health Insurance Card is not acquired, the participant is medically insured – including third party and accidents.
